

SUPERHERO CLUBHOUSE INTERNSHIPS

We offer unpaid internships to students who are able to receive school credit– or anyone who is able to secure outside funding– for working with us. Please note that we are a small organization with a two person staff.

ANYTIME INTERNSHIP

We have a spectrum of projects in development and production at various times of the year. Depending on the timeframe you're available for an internship, we'll pair you with a project to observe or support if/as needed.

For example, in May-June 2025 we'll be in rehearsals and production for the culmination of the 15th annual *Big Green Theater* eco-playwriting program, taking place at the New York Harbor School on Governors Island. This year, students will be creating songs, monologues, and puppets inspired by the amazing migratory fish of the Mahicantuck (Hudson River), which will be shared with the school and will be included in Riverkeeper's Fish Migration Celebration. If May-June is your timeframe, we might pair you with this project, which would mean that you would A) attend and observe rehearsals, B) support performances by helping transport materials, set up snacks, or take on stage management tasks.

For another example, later this year we'll be hosting a development process and play-test performances for *There Will Be Monsters*, a theatrical game experience for a hopeful climate future. Depending on your timeframe and interest, an internship might be focused on project-specific research to help in the continued development of this project, as well as participating in play-tests to help us test elements of the project.

Regardless of the timeframe or the project, we will ask interns to support the operating of Superhero Clubhouse throughout the course of their internship by taking on various research tasks, such as:

- Grant research to expand our database of possible funding sources.
- Researching examples of Tangible Hope to share in monthly newsletters and beyond.
- Researching potential partners or host organizations in the Mahicantuck (Hudson River) Valley.

We are able to accommodate 1 Anytime Intern per timeframe. If you are interested in being an Anytime Intern, please email your resume to info@superheroclubhouse.org with the subject line “[Month-Month] Internship” (for example, “May-July Internship”) and briefly tell us why you'd be a good fit. Beforehand, you can also reach out to ask us

what projects are happening during a certain timeframe, to make sure something is indeed happening and that it's exciting to you.
